Research says that bilingualism...

- improves focus, memory and decision making abilities (Bialystok, 2010 & 2013);
- develops strong thinkers (solving problems, using logic, flexibility, creative thinking) (Zelasko & Antunez, 2000; Kessler & Quinn, 1980; Bialystok & Majumber, 2011; Kharkhurin, 2010; Leiken, 2012);
- increases socio-emotional development (Kovacs & Mehler, 2009);

- helps question prejudices (Keysar, Hayakawa & An, 2011);
- enhances empathy (Crosbie, 2014);

The three biggest advantages to start French Immersion in K-1




The Early French Immersion Program provides...

- the most inclusive learning environment;
- the best results for oral fluency and spontaneity in French language

(pronunciation, confidence);

good literacy results in both languages;

The three biggest advantages to start French Immersion in Grade 4



An 8-9 year old child...

- usually chooses the program which means a strong motivation to succeed;
- * already understands school routines and can focus on learning a new language;
- can already read and write, which speeds up the acquisition of new language.

The three biggest advantages to start French Immersion in Grade 6



A 10-11 year old child...

- welcomes the opportunity and challenge to start a new program during a natural break (Elementary to Middle school);
- has a strong understanding of school & social routines;
- has highly developed English language skills that can be transferred to French.

Percentage of French taught in Immersion



Elementary		Middle		Secondary
K-2	3-5	6-7	8-9	10-12
100%	80%	80%	50% +	No less than 25%





- Research indicates that second language learners transfer their literacy skills to English.
- Provincial assessment confirms student achievement in English.
- French Immersion students' scores are comparable and in some cases higher in non-French subjects.

Is French Immersion for all children?

Research indicates that all children will succeed if given support.



Would my child have a different curriculum to follow?

Teachers teach the same curriculum as outlined by the British Columbia Ministry of Education for each grade level and subject area.







- Encouragement is what is most important.
- Continue supporting your child in English with daily reading.
- Establish good communication with your child's teacher.
- Have your child talk to you about their work and what they are doing at school.

French at Home



- Look at French books, channels, YouTube videos, and apps.
- Start using common phrases like: 'Bonjour.'' 'Merci.'' 'Comment ça va?''
- Your child will learn French songs. Sing along with them.
- Give your child the job of teaching you how to speak French.

Cultural Opportunities

- Schools host presentations that promote French language and culture.
- Schools facilitate French Cultural Days to promote the culture, the language and to help the students
 understand the history of French in Canada.
 - Middle and Secondary schools facilitate cultural exchange trips with French students.
